Science	Our Science topic this term is Earth and Space Create your own information text about the different planets in the solar system. Remember to research to collect facts, write these in your own words to explain what you have found out, and include amazing illustrations.		
Geography	Our Geography topic this term is Enough for Everyone Research a country that has a lot of people who can't access important resources like food and water. Write a report on this country. Remember to research to collect facts, explain the reasons why resources are scarce in this country (for example, climate) and include geographical information (for example, the capital city, types of land use).		
Art and DT	Our Art topic this term is Land Art Land Art is brilliant because all you need is some outside space and natural materials (autumn is the perfect season). Look at these <u>impressive examples</u> and then create your own (smaller-scale!) land art piece. Send us a photo when you're finished!		
Spanish	<u>Duolingo</u> Duolingo is a website and app that will help you to build your Spanish skills. You will need to ask your parents/carers to help you set up an account, but after that the games, quizzes and rewards system are all easy to use.		
Computing	<u>Hour of Code</u> Build your coding skills by trying out some of the activities on the website above.		
Music	<u>Viking Saga Songs</u> Next term our history topic is based on the Vikings. Build your knowledge now by watching these saga songs!		
P.E.	<u>60 second challenges</u> Click the link above to try out our first week of 60 second challenges.		
PSHE	<u>Aiming high – my strengths</u> Think positive and reflect on your own strengths. These strengths could be at school or outside of school, or character strength
