Science

Light

Geography

The Street Beneath My Feet
We learn about the destructive powers of nature, from volcanoes and earthquakes to tsunamis and tornadoes. Through discussion and practical tasks, we will learn about how and why these natural phenomena occur, and the ways in which they affect people.

History

Savage Stone Age
We learn how the period impacted on life in Britain. How early man survived in a harsh environment and about homes, food, tools and defence. Investigate Skara Brae & how archaeological evidence is important. Learn different theories about Stonehenge.

RE and PSHE

RE
This term will focus on 'What do different people believe?'

This term will focus on Health and Wellbeing. Looking at a healthy diet, setting goals and health and safety in the community.
