- We have appointed a new PE lead to enhance and improve our PE offer.
- We have already started our active lunchtime sessions through our sports coaching company children get to participate in daily sessions over the lunch time which includes dance, football, tennis, swing ball, archery and much more!
- We are planning to reintroduce weekly forest school sessions.
- We are purchasing a new cross curricular orienteering course, which will include multiple options for lessons, planning, maps and training.
