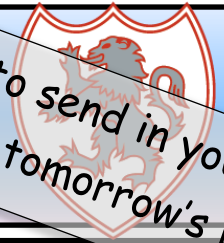

This is a tough one!

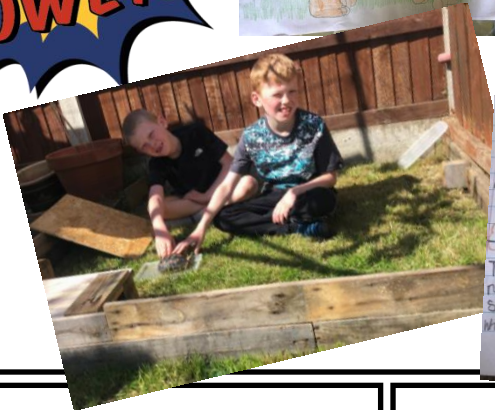
We've seen some amazing home learning this week!

Sumatran Tiger
