PLEASE REMEMBER-DROP OFF AND GO, PICK UP AND LEAVE

A MESSAGE FROM MR MILNER

As you will no doubt be aware, we have had a challenging week at Banks Lane. We are lucky to be a large full school - but that unfortunately means that every single day there are over 400 individual people walking into our school, potentially carrying COVID - more often than not, without symptoms! I am really proud that as a community we have been able to keep everyone safe since March and we only had our first confirmed case last week. Thank you again for all your support.

We currently have two classes isolating due to confirmed positive COVID cases. Unfortunately, more cases in those classes have been confirmed during this isolation. I would like to wish everyone with symptoms a speedy recovery as I am aware that some people are very unwell.

You may also know that we've had to send further teachers home because the NHS track and trace 'app' has falsely identified them as close contacts to a positive case - I can confirm, staff contacted through the app have had no direct contact whatsoever. They have been sent into isolation due to the proximity of their phones and blue tooth connectivity through classroom/stockroom walls and would face a potential fine of £1000 if they came to work. This is hugely frustrating - but we must follow the guidelines. For their period of self-isolation we have two supply teachers to cover the classes - Mr Edgell and Miss Hussain. Although this is not ideal, I had to make the difficult decision between bringing in teachers or sending home a further 60 children (none of whom have been in contact with COVID positive cases within school).

Following on from the class closures, as a precautionary measure the Local Authority authorised all members of staff to take a COVID test. I can confirm that all staff actively supported this request and all staff who were not already in isolation tested negative for COVID-19. I do hope this offers some reassurance to you all - as it has for me.

I have been in daily contact with staff who are teaching from home and I am so impressed by the levels of remote learning undertaken by all of the children currently isolating. I also had the pleasure of joining their daily Google Meet session this afternoon. The children are a credit to both you and our school - keep up the good work!

I wish I could say I know what the next few weeks will bring, but please be assured we will continue to follow all of the measures we have put in place to ensure BLJS is as safe and sanitised as possible. Pupil and staff safety will always come first. Unfortunately, I think it is inevitable that we will have more positive cases and therefore need to close further bubbles in the future. Our risk assessment means that we are well placed to control any outbreaks as much as possible, therefore limiting the impact bubble closures have on the community. If we do need to close a class or bubble, you will be informed by text and email.

If your child tests positive please inform us as quickly as possible using the <u>admin@bankslane-jun.stockport.sch.uk</u> email address. This will be checked daily and on a Sunday to support efficient bubble closures.

Finally, I would like to thank you, our parents and carers for the incredible levels of support you have shown throughout this whole pandemic so far. I'm sure we will continue to grow stronger as a whole school community. For now, take care.

- Please can all children log in to Google Classroom this week to check they know how to do this. The login
 information is in the packs which were sent home a few weeks ago. If you have any problems, please
 let their class teacher know through the year group email.
- If you are unable to access Google Classroom as your do not have internet access or a computer or tablet, please let your child's class teacher know.
- We have found Google Classroom works best when opened through an internet browser rather than the Google app.

The children who have been working from home have shown a lot of resilience and it has been great to see the effort and enthusiasm they have put into their work.
