SCOIAL MEDIA/INTERNET SAFETY

Within the first two days of us returning to school we had to deal with several cases of children misusing social media at home. Please can we remind you that sites such as TikTok, Facebook, Snapchat, Twitter, Instagram, Musical.ly and Skype <u>should only be accessed by children over the age of 13.</u> WhatsApp have just changed their regulations to state that children <u>under the age of 16 should not be using their site.</u> If you allow your children to use these sites without parental control you are opening them up to the possibility of on-line bullying or even grooming.

We have been concerned about E-safety for some time now and before Christmas we asked the children to complete an anonymous E-safety survey. The results were concerning. Therefore, we have arranged for Tanya Cross, Stockport's Schools Health & Well Being Adviser to come into school on 28th January from 2.00 - 3.00 pm to advise parents about E-safety. An invitation will be coming out soon to all parents. Do please come along if you can.

SMARTWATCHES

Santa has been kind to many of our children and brought them Smart watches for Christmas. Unfortunately, it is not appropriate for children to be wearing these watches in school. These watches can be used to phone, text and, most concerning, take photos. As they are wearing them on their wrists, this is like they are permanently carrying a mobile phone around school with them.

Also, these watches are expensive and may get damaged on the playground.

We strongly discourage children from bringing mobile phones/smart watches into school with them. If they must do so, they must keep them in their pocket or bag and then hand them into the teacher as soon as they get into class. They should never have them in their hand or on the playground. We are very concerned that images are not taken of our children using any mobile device, therefore please ask your child to leave their Smart watch at home.
