## PLEASE REMEMBER - DROP OFF AND GO, PICK UP AND LEAVE

#### COVID

You may have seen in the press this week that the Government has said that schools can close a day early at Christmas to give teachers a "proper break" and that we are allowed to have an INSET day next Friday to allow "six clear days" before Christmas Eve. What has been hidden deeper in the press is that the Government want schools to run a track and trace system for the first six days of the holiday and any day taken on Friday will need to be paid back at a later date or by returning to school earlier in January. This clearly goes against any claim that school leaders and teachers will get a proper break.

With this in mind we will NOT be changing our term dates. I do not feel that a change this close to the end of term would be beneficial to children, parents or teachers: I do not want to ask parents to find alternative child care with one weeks' notice, and ask teachers and children to return earlier than scheduled in January.

A small team will run the track and trace system as instructed by the government for the first six days up to and including Christmas Eve. We will inform you clearly of how this will work next week.
