COVIDUPDATE

Thank you again for supporting us with our procedures to keep your children safe. As I am sure you are aware several Stockport schools have now had to reduce their provision by closing classes or bubbles and we feel it is inevitable that this will happen to our school at some point.

We are aware that when this happens here the changes to our provision may be frustrating for you with regards to childcare arrangements and attendance at work but I am sure you will agree, this is a serious matter and it is essential that our school only provides face to face lessons when it is safe to do so.

When we have a confirmed case in school we will contact and be advised by the local Health Protection Team and will inform you immediately of the outcome. If we have a confirmed case of COVID 19 in school, you will be sent a text which will inform you of the actions we are taking and the class/bubble which must self-isolate for 14 days. If this happens during the school day, you will be asked to collect your child from school immediately. You may receive the text in the evening or early morning so that we can give you as much notice as possible. Home learning will be available on the remote learning part of our website by 9am the next school day.

Please help us by adhering to our procedures. Follow our one way procedures, drop your child and go and do not stand on the playground talking to other parents. We apologise to the parents who have to stand on the field, especially in this wet weather, but we need to keep the path clear for you and your child's protection. - a high temperature
- a continuous cough
- a change or loss of taste or smell

The Department of Health and Social Care has assured us that appointments are being released throughout each day, so if you phone and cannot book an appointment locally, leave it an hour and phone again. If you cannot book online e.g. you do not have a computer at home, phone 119.

If you have any queries about your symptoms phone 111. If you arrange a test for your child and it is positive, please let school know immediately and follow the government guidance of self-isolation.

The government has advised primary schools that at this moment in time, children do not need to wear masks in primary schools. However, if you feel that you would prefer your child to wear a face mask, that is your decision and we will support you in that, but please ask your child not to keep touching the mask as that will increase the risk, rather than protecting them.

PUPIL PREMIUM PLUS

If your child was previously looked after by a Local Authority in England or Wales immediately before being adopted, subject to a special guardianship order, a child arrangement order or a Residence Order, the school can claim additional monies each year via Pupil Premium Plus funding to support the educational needs of your child.

Declaration is on a voluntary basis. If you would like us to claim for your child, you must inform us before Thursday, 21st January 2021. We will need to see a copy of the court order or a letter from the Local Authority that places the child with you. We will then update our annual census.

Please be aware that this information must be declared each time your child starts a new school. Therefore, if this applies to your child, and it is your child's first year with us, we would appreciate it, if you could make contact with us. We are happy to discuss the use of Pupil Premium with you. You can also view our Pupil Premium Policy and spending on our school website.

The information you provide will be treated as confidential.

INTERNET CONTENT

We have been made aware of some potentially inappropriate and disturbing content circulating on social media which may be being viewed by our children and young people. In line with previous advice from CEOP we would encourage parents to work to create a positive relationship with their children around their internet use, closely supervising younger children's online access, and crucially, ensuring their children feel they can tell them (or another trusted adult) if they ever encounter anything worrying. Parental controls go some way to protecting accidentally children from disturbing content but are unlikely to prevent it in many cases, for example when content has been deliberately spliced into content aimed at children.
