# WORLD BOOK DAY

### ABSENCE

We have a number of children absent from school at the moment for various health issues.

As I'm sure you are aware, Stockport Family Education Welfare, come into school on a regular basis and scrutinise the registers. If your child has had several periods of absence you may well be contacted by them. If your child is a little under the weather, we are happy for you to send them into school and we will phone you if they become too poorly to be here. We are also happy for parents to bob into school at lunchtimes to administer Calpol etc, if they feel that will help. Unfortunately, school staff are prohibited from administering medicine unless it is prescribed by the doctor and the dose is 4 times a day.

If your child is sick or has diarrhoea, they must be kept at home for 48 hours after the last episode. This is the advice from Dr Baxter, Head of Communicable Diseases.

Due to a special assembly this morning where the children were visited by the Travelling by Tuba band the Headteacher awards will be announced on Monday 25<sup>th</sup> February.


