However, we are very pleased and proud to report that our Y6 children at Banks Lane have achieved significantly better. The proportion of children at Banks Lane meeting the expected standard in each subject is well above the national average.

HEATWAVE

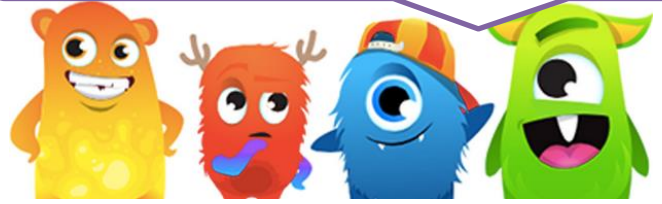
