## COVID RESTRICTIONS IN SCHOOL - UPDATE.

As promised back in July, we are looking at ways to ease restrictions within school over the coming weeks and are pleased to share the next steps with you;

## Lunchtimes

From Monday 27<sup>th</sup> September, all pupils will return to the dining hall for lunchtime. This means children will no longer eat in the classrooms and those on school meals will return to a choice of daily menu.

### Breakfast Club

Breakfast club will return to the dining hall from Monday 27<sup>th</sup> September. We have also lifted the limit on how many children are able to attend each day. Children will still sit with those from their own bubble for the moment. Breakfast club must still be booked in advance of attendance. If you have a large TV or any DVD's you would be happy to donate to breakfast club, please send them to the school office.

### **Assemblies**

We are working towards the return of whole school assemblies in the hall. For the 24<sup>th</sup> Sept and 1<sup>st</sup> Oct we will hold separate lower and upper school assemblies and are looking forward to our first whole school assembly on Friday 8<sup>th</sup> October.

## School Trips

The first of our school trips have already been booked and we are costing out the residentials for Years 4, 5 and 6 at the moment - letters for these will go out within the next few weeks.

Whilst we are excited to implement changes which see us moving back to 'normal' we are still being cautious with our approach, so for the moment the following will remain;

#### **Toilets**

Toilets will continue to be bubble restricted to support the extra handwashing throughout the day; this will be reviewed again in the next few weeks.

#### Playground

Playground - we are keeping the playground and field zones for the moment - this could become permanent as we have seen many positives to children having different areas at break times. If your child uses the field for playtime you may want to send a spare pair of old wellies/trainers in as the weather gets wetter.

#### Parent Consultations

Parent consultations will go ahead via telephone. Due to COVID and the continuing evening building works we feel it is safest not to invite parents into school just yet. We will send out letters with further details nearer the time.

We are all looking forward to the return of after school clubs. Please bear with us, after school clubs are delayed due to the building works within school rather than COVID restrictions - we are looking at all clubs returning at the beginning of next half term.

Great job Green team, you are our weekly dojo winners!




The class with the highest dojo points this week is 5L, well done to you!
