## SCHOOL MONEY, MESSAGE FROM EDUSPOT

At Eduspot we are always striving to find ways to make our systems better. Over the last couple months, we have been working hard to make some big changes to SchoolMoney. Right now a lot of it is behind the scenes, allowing us to make the changes without interfering with your day to day running of the system. Outside of some performance enhancements and minor bug fixes, we have been improving security throughout SchoolMoney.

Later this month, you will notice when you login, a new option in the top right of the screen, where you can change your password yourselves. For added security, if you decide to change your password, you will receive an SMS or Email notification to let you know this has happened. It will not divulge the password in the message, it will simply prompt you to login using the password you have set yourself, and act as a security prompt just in case this was unexpected.

Based on parent feedback, we are also changing the link in the SMS message you receive when a new item is ready to pay for, so that you will no longer be taken to <u>www.eduspot.co.uk</u>, but instead will be taken directly to the parent login page, to avoid any confusion of where to go to log in.

Further down the line we will be adding self-service password resetting tools for parents who have forgotten their password and are unable to log in.
