This week, Year 5 have been on a trip to John Rylands Library in Manchester. As well as exploring the amazing library building, books and artefacts, we also took part in a mapping workshop, using a variety of different maps to investigate how Manchester has changed over time.

First, we used a modern, tourist map to locate significant buildings in Manchester. We then used our chronology skills to order the buildings by the date they were constructed; the earliest was Manchester Cathedral which was built in 1215, only 149 years after the Battle of Hastings.

It was a brilliant trip that we all thoroughly enjoyed. It has also provided us all with some key skills for our future History and Geography topics: Marvellous Maps and Contrasting Localities (exploring the History and Geography of Stockport and Conwy).
