
We also asked some of our pupils what they thought, here is some of the feedback received;

COVID	SAFETY
As you are aware Government guidelines regarding COVID changed again yesterday. We have now received updated guidance from the DFE and Local Authority. We will update our risk assessment in adherence of this guidance to reflect the below; <u>COVID positive</u> Whilst there is no longer a legal requirement to isolate, the guidance we have received states there is still an expectation to isolate if you test positive or are symptomatic and are awaiting a COVID test result. In order to prevent the spread of COVID within school and to protect vulnerable pupils and staff our COVID absence rules will remain the same. Any pupil who tests positive must not attend school for 5 days and until symptom free. Any child who shows one of the main three symptoms (high temp, loss or change to taste or smell, continuous cough) must have a negative test result before returning to school. <u>Close contacts</u> If you are a close contact of somebody with COVID there is no longer a requirement to test daily before attending school. Staff are no longer requested to test twice weekly. <u>Facemasks</u> Face masks are no longer mandatory in school, any member of staff, visitor, contractor or parent onsite is still more than welcome to wear a mask if preferred. <u>Hygiene</u> We will continue with good hygiene rules (ensuring children wash hands and sanitise regularly), extra cleaning and will also keep all spaces within school well ventilated. <u>Holiday Support Vouchers</u> This is a reminder that the holiday support vouchers issued for the half term and Easter holidays are due to expire next	<ul> <li>On Thursday, every class tuned into a special E-Safety assembly run by Google. 
