

## REMOTE LEARNING FEEDBACK

Thank you to everyone who completed the remote learning survey we sent out before half term. The vast majority of comments were incredibly positive! Thank you. As always, we will take on board all of the feedback we have received. We're delighted that so many people feel happy with the remote learning package offered – although we're hopeful that we won't need to do it again any time soon!

#### <u>Here's a brief overview and a selection of parent comments:</u>

100% of respondents felt that support was easy or very easy to access. Only one parent felt that resources were difficult to access in Google Classroom. 94% felt that Google Meets live sessions were helpful and accessed the sessions more than once a day.

"Google classroom has been excellent and the teachers have evolved it for the better along the way."
