

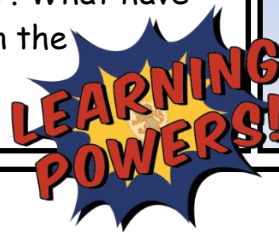

Today's Challenge!

Decorate Easter Eggs!

There are several methods you could use. One method is to hard boil the egg for 15mins then soak it in water, 1tsp white vinegar and 20 drops of food colouring which will dye the egg. You can then decorate. Alternatively, you can it decorate without dying it.

You could use the 'blown out' method. This is where you pierce the egg at the top and bottom using a pin. Put a cocktail stick through the bottom hole to make it larger and to pierce the yolk. Then, you blow through the top hole making the egg come out of the bottom. Do this over a bowl so you can keep it and make scrambled egg for lunch! Give the empty egg a wash in wash water and it is ready to decorate! You could use paint, permanent marker, glitter - go wild! Why not look into the history of decorated eggs?
