



BANKS LANE SUMMER READING TIPS



Banks Lane's tips for keeping your children reading through the summer holidays...

- 1. Join your library 'Summer Reading Challenge'
- 2. Dive into summer-themed books for example 'The Summer Dolphin' by Holly Webb and David Dean (ages 7+) and 'The Super Sunny Murder Club' by Serena Patel and Robin Stevens (ages 9+)
- 3. Organise outdoor reading adventures like packing a picnic basket full of books and snacks.
- 4. Incorporate reading into holiday travel for example, take books or e-readers on the car or train
- 5. Explore events and festivals your local library will have story-telling sessions, interactive workshops and author signings.
- 6. The power of postcards postcards also provide a fantastic way to keep children engaged with reading during the summer break. Ask your friends and family who are going on a day trip or a holiday to send postcards to you and your children, offering them a delightful opportunity to not only learn about their adventures from different destinations around the world but enjoy short snippets of reading along the way. Children may even want to send a postcard to their new teacher at school ready for them to read in September.
- 7. And remember for reluctant readers reading to your children and sharing a love of books also allows pupils to develop their reading skills by hearing fluency and expression and talking about what they are reading.
